Minutes from the Previous Meeting

OMCSAR Chapter Meeting Heritage Cafeteria December 19, 2015

The Snow Campaign of December 1775 was one of the first major military operations of the Revolution in the southern colonies. An army of up to 3000 Patriot militia under Colonel Richard Richardson marched against Loyalist recruiting centers in South Carolina after the Loyalists under Thomas Fletchall seized gunpowder and ammunition intended for the Cherokee. On

December 12, Richardson captured Fletchall found hiding in a cave. On December 22 the Patriots attacked the Loyalists camp killing five or six and taking 136 prisoners. The next day it began snowing making the return march home difficult for the victorious Patriot militia who were ill clothed for the weather. Thus the expedition, which eliminated large scale Loyalist activity in the backcountry, became known as The Snow Campaign.

Missouri Society, SAR Awards Silver Good Citizenship Medal

Sgt. Edgar R. Fox was awarded the Silver Good Citizenship Medal by Missouri Society, SAR at The Annual Luncheon to Honor the American Veteran held on November 14, 2015. The event was attended by members of the Ozark Mountain Chapter SAR, Rachel Donelson Chapter DAR, Military Order of the Purple Heart MOPH, General Society of War of 1812, and guests. The medal was presented to Fox by Past President General NSSAR, David N. Appleby for Fox's notable service in behalf of American principles. Fox served his country in the U.S. Marine Corps during World War II with distinguished service for which he received several awards. After his release from the Marines, Fox joined the U.S. Army Counter Intelligence School which qualified him to serve in a number of assignments during the Korean War and during the Cold War.

After his retirement Fox settled in Springfield, Missouri where he became involved with the Marine League, coordinating Honor Flights and Toys for Tots, as well as, a variety of other activities related to the Marine League. Sgt. Edgar Fox is a true American Patriot having served his

country in war time and peace time with the same dedication and faithfulness.
